
Letter from the President and Chair

Enrollment

From the last year to this current school year, our student body has grown significantly. While our population was approximately 292 students in 2021-22, our in-house Preschool to Grade 12 number has grown to over 315! Additionally, ACA@Home launched into its first full year in



2022-23, which welcomed another 191 students who are receiving home ed. facilitation through certified teachers on our ACA staff. More detail on this exciting addition will be shared through our Alternative Programs report.

Repayment of Private Lenders

In January 2022, the ACA Board and Administration, convicted by our inaction to repay our private lenders, confessed our wrongdoing and committed to steps for repayment. Some of these lenders first made loans to ACA as far back as 2012, and have been exceptionally gracious to us.

The school leadership is excited to report that within this school year, approximately \$175,000 will be repaid to our private lenders from our operations funds, with a line of sight to completely pay back these overdue loans over the next four years. This has been made possible by donations from strong supporters of Christian education, and through significant budget reductions in the 2022-23 school year. In addition to the amount above, another donor couple graciously converted their loan to a donation. Wow! As Scripture states, when God's people repent and humble themselves, He will provide!

This year, we have been able to have all 140+ Secondary students in

the Chapel on Wednesdays for student-led worship, guest and in-house speakers, and a time of sword drills, and prayer. In the Elementary, we rotate between Grades 1-3, Grades 4-6 and then a Grades 1-6 Chapel as well. When students are not in the Chapel

We are very grateful for the spiritual work they do for ACA.

Mrs. Young continues to meet with individual students regularly for Christ-centered counselling and prayer. Her office operates with a drop-in, open-door policy.

Staff members continue to mentor alumni by keeping in contact through social media and by meeting in person. Many of our alumni are continuing biblical studies at various biblical institutions and missional projects.

Our Secondary Service Days are aimed to get our students out of the classroom to learn new skills, build community among the grades and serve our community. We have found that this promotes mental and spiritual health in our students by teaching them the value of Christian service. Some options for Service Day include evangelistic outreach, packing shoeboxes both on campus and at Samaritan's Purse, playing games with seniors at Bethany Care Center, cleaning churches, painting, and doing projects around the school.

This year's Senior High leadership options class took on three major projects in the second quarter. They reopened the café for Secondary students, ran a clothing drive for the Mustard Seed and painted the east end stairwell with the theme "In Christ I am:".

We will be taking a team of 13 students and 3 teachers to Honduras in April 2023. Jericho Ministries will host us and we are praying to build a strong relationship with Jericho by blessing them as they bless us. www.jerichoministries.org

Intentional and Diverse Instruction in Secondary in 2022-23

If you haven't spent time around the Secondary wings of ACA this year, I highly recommend you walk through our halls! We have a fresh energy and unity shining through Grades 7-12 students in exciting new ways. Leadership, discipleship, academic excellence, and diversity are

Secondary teachers are implementing the Individual Program Plans developed in the fall to provide a flexible learning environment for all of our students. Our resource and teaching teams work hard to ensure no student is left behind.

We are proud of the change in student attitudes around -2 pathways for Secondary students. It has become an increasingly popular pathway for a variety of students. Feedback from teachers,

students, and parents on the -2 programs has been verv encouraging; noting that many students feel more successful and enjoy learning in this alternate course pathway. **Teachers** note feeling more supported, as this allows specialization them to bring their best to the students in their classrooms. Mr. Wiskar, our new hire, is teaching some of these -2 courses and bringing relationship and excellence to our course team alongside Mr. Wong!



wonderful themes we see increasingly represented in our students in 2022-23. ACA's Secondary Program balances a high academic standard while offering academic and spiritual support that ensures students can rise to the challenges presented and the call of God in their lives.

We have expanded our

S.T.E.M. offerings by investing in new coding and robotics tools and are expanding our Science Fair for its second year. This year we will take our top projects to the Calgary Youth Science Fair to represent ACA. Our Junior High students have really enjoyed the new Coding, 3D Printing/Design, and Robotics offerings led by Mr. Wong, Mr. Wiskar and Mr. Laidlow. Funds

donated by an alumni family are helping to strengthen our S.T.E.M. programming with the upcoming purchase of additional 3D printers. Expanding this program area is a wonderful step towards being educational leaders and raising the leaders of tomorrow.

We want to ensure our teachers are educational leaders in their subject matter. ACA teachers attend multiple professional development opportunities throughout the year. Many of our teachers were also able to lead professional learning sessions for other independent school teachers from around Alberta, as ACA hosted the ACSI AB Teachers' Convention this past fall.

Warriors Block has been expanded to two weekly hours for Grades 7-12s this year. This change has allowed for more school-life balance for those students who use it effectively. During this time, students can access teachers, independent workspaces, and educational support. We offer this dedicated time to all students to relieve some of the pressures of homework and group projects on families and ensure student well-being and balance is a priority while still maintaining our high academic standards.

Students can feel overwhelmed when work piles up alongside other extracurricular commitments. To better honour the goals of assessment and our students' time, we have begun collaboratively scheduling tests to try and space them out. Teachers are also asked to continually evaluate their assessments and homework load to match the age and course level appropriateness and check that that grade does not have another assessment on that day.

We have continued our dedication to excellence by maintaining semester-end exams for Grades 7-12 and recognizing academic achievement.

This year's exciting new course offerings include Criminal Law, Leadership and a second Fitness offering. We have continued to offer Secondary students a variety of options to ensure they have many opportunities to explore their gifts and passions. As we expand our elective offerings, we become more competitive with other secondary schools and give our students a broader educational experience that will serve them well into the future!

Elementary teachers are implementing the new Alberta Curriculum and Program of Studies. This school year, Alberta schools are implementing a new Math and Language Arts Curriculum in Kindergarten-Grade 3. New PE and Wellness curriculum has been introduced in

Kindergarten-Grade 6. Teachers put great thought into rewriting their long-range plans to reflect the new outcomes. flexibility in the guiding questions allows for diverse instruction to meet student needs. Our teachers have been intentional to build Biblical integration into all subject areas.

Renfrew Educational Services has received a funding grant through AISCA which allowed them to provide services including occupational therapy,

speech therapy, and consultation with a psychologist. Professionals visited ACA to observe students and meet with teachers. Some of their time was spent in small groups and the rest in whole-class instruction. Their goal was to better equip staff to support students with diverse needs and intentional skill-building.

Elementary teachers and education assistants (EAs) are providing a flexible learning environment for all students. EAs collaborate with teachers and the Resource Coordinator to support a differentiated learning environment through individualized and small-group support

in the classroom, Resource Room, and break-out spaces. When seeking strategies to support student success, teachers may recommend a referral for specialist support and/or a more formal diagnosis.

For more information on the therapists and assessments available for our students, or assistance with sourcing outside specialists, please contact our Resource Coordinator. Informational resources are available on many topics, including parent workshops, literacy



development, mental health awareness, psycho-educational assessment, support strategies, and accessing support services. The Resource Coordinator, Mrs. Tara Laidlow, is the facilitator of referrals as recommended by teachers or requested by parents. Literacy Support programs are provided for students in Grades 1-6, including English as an Additional Language Learners. The Reading Intervention program provides individualized reading and phonics support for students in Grades 1-3. Students in Grades 4-6 can receive Literacy Support, three classes per week, in place of French. Additional student support was provided through the Learning Disruption funding implemented by Alberta Education, to address literacy and numeracy learning loss due to Covid.

Elementary students enjoy the use of Chromebooks to support their learning through Google Classroom, IXL, Vocabulary A-Z, Accelerated Reader, and more.

Elementary students were involved in opportunities to serve Jesus and show God's love by giving through Operation Christmas Child (OCC) and the Mustard Seed. Students were encouraged to give their time to pack boxes and fill out labels, even if they couldn't contribute financially. The Grade 1 class went to visit the OCC Warehouse in Calgary to see it all in action.

New playground equipment was purchased in 2022 with funds from the annual Read-a-Thon. We look forward to installation this spring. Read-a-Thon 2023 raised funds for our Fine Arts program, and we look forward to augmenting our instrument, music, and visual art supplies.





Caring Culture

Caring for our students through:

Internal and Alberta Education surveys across Elementary and Secondary grades have allowed administrators and teachers to assess our school culture, address behaviours of concern, and plan for increased unity in our school family. We have received wonderful feedback from students this year on the health of relationships at our school. Any issue that was raised through our *Safe and Caring Culture Surveys* was dealt with promptly by our staff, and we are working to ensure students continue to see ACA as a healthy, caring environment for years to come.

Continued focus on correction, resolution, and restoration has been paramount to our unity this year. Our research-based restorative justice

approach to discipline seeks to get to the heart of issues instead of simply reacting to them at the moment. Students are better equipped to resolve conflict and grow towards a healthy life



in



Christ through joint responses from those that care for them including students, teachers, parents, educational support staff, administration, and our chaplaincy. Our staff use incident reporting forms to accurately hear and record each child's story and address it appropriately.

This year we created an improved cell phone policy, based on consultation with other schools and emerging best-practice, that asks students to keep cell phones and Bluetooth headphones away during school hours. We have seen a quick change in student engagement and community through this revised procedure. We are so proud of our students and staff for continuing to build learning-focused spaces during the school day.

Elementary and Secondary Clubs support student interests and growth at ACA; these include: Guitar, Chess, S.W.O.R.D., Intramurals, Audio-Visual Teams, Tech Support Teams, Worship Teams, Project Positivity, Leadership Teams, and Missions Teams.

S.W.O.R.D., our club of student leaders, organizes community-building theme days and events. Some notable days this year have included: PJ and Pancakes Day, Ugly Christmas Sweater Day, Red and Green Day, Glow in the Dark Day, Christmas Character Day, Christmas Hat or Socks, Warriors Day, Star Wars Day, etc.

Our athletics program has been thriving and growing in wonderful ways this year. Elementary and Secondary students benefit from a variety of options that include

cross-country running, basketball, volleyball, soccer, badminton, and track-and-field. We also offer many courses that support our Secondary athletes, including two fitness offerings and PE courses that expose our students to skating, sailing, skiing, curling, etc. This year our teams are competing at higher levels and taking home numerous medals, representing us well and building the foundations for a continuously

healthy lifestyle in our students.

Our second annual Truth and Reconciliation Day in September was approached with love, care, age-appropriateness, and a biblical perspective by each of our teachers. Every grade spent time praying around the flag pole for our FNMI brothers and sisters.

New students were welcomed warmly by staff and students. We're so thankful to have them join us and we are encouraged to see a wonderful influx of student registrations for the coming school year. This has led to the need for a waitlist and many exciting new plans heading into the 2023-24 school year. Please keep us in prayer as we plan and grow.

We also continue to connect with our international students who have returned to their home countries, as they are forever a part of our ACA family!

Our students participated in our first-ever Multicultural Week back in November 2022. The week included a Parade of Nations, multicultural games fair, a Team Canada live soccer game, multicultural projects and a multicultural potluck. We also followed this event with an internal survey and discovered that our school community comprises over 45 nationalities! We are always looking for more



ways to honour the diversity that God has brought to ACA and to celebrate together as the body of Christ. Many of these special events were designed from past consultations with students on improving unity and the health of student experiences at ACA. This is an exciting time for the kingdom of God at ACA, as our diversity is a clear strength and opportunity to take Jesus to the nations!

Secondary retreats have created a legacy culture in the Grade 12s and 9s, as they want to shape the positive community of the school as they move on to new endeavours next year. The grade nines have even published a book to guide future Junior High students through tough questions about going into Junior High!

Caring for our staff through:

We have placed communication limits for staff time. This change ensures teachers can honour their time with family and with God without the disruption that constant communication often brings. Staff are now asked to respond to communications within working hours of 7am to 5pm, and not on weekends, holidays, or breaks. Teachers are unlikely to respond while teaching and may choose to schedule responses during the next working day. We hope this will align better with our desire to see

We have continued our staff recognition and bonding, including visits from food trucks and Christmas parties. We have also created a new staff-led committee for planning and executing fun staff bonding events.

Secondary teachers feel more supported as we have pursued the expansion of our -2 stream. We know that our teachers desire a community of excellence but note it is harder to achieve when they are splitting their efforts between often very different content in -1 and -2 courses. Splitting into two separate courses and teachers has shown we are listening to the input of our teachers and students for the best educational experiences we can provide.

Caring for our families and community through:

We value the connection between families and staff. We continue to evaluate our options for new family connections and host family fun days like our Winter Family Hayride and other family connections nights that support parents through the ever-changing world of parenting and raising kids who love Jesus.



We continue to provide wonderful parent resources to all our Secondary families through our subscription to AXIS.org, which we provide for free. In an ever-changing world, this tool helps us translate the culture around our kids through a biblical lens and gives us toolkits to discuss hard topics with our teens and preteens. If you have not used this tool yet, I highly recommend it!

We have been choosing our fundraisers carefully to support the financial needs of ACA while also providing a valuable service to those who purchase the products.

Strengthening communication with parents through Google Classroom, PowerSchool, effective report cards, parent-teacher meetings, and in-person meetings to address needs and concerns as quickly and effectively as possible.

We strive to be cognisant of urgent needs among our school family, staff, board and families and respond generously! Christmas Hampers were sponsored and delivered to 12 families, and we continually support individual families through difficult situations to better reflect the heart of the greater church as outlined in scripture.

We have built community internally and with outside stakeholders through Elementary support of the Mustard Seed, Samaritan's Purse and other ministries and monthly Secondary Service Days that have connected with several churches, seniors homes, food banks, and youth organizations in Airdrie and beyond. Our students are learning the heart of Christ in practical ways that allow them to grow. We deeply value this community connection as a part of authentic faith-building for our students and loving our community as Christ calls us to do.

The business side of ACA is a fast-paced, ever-changing part of the school, working behind the scenes. We are always

looking at streamlining processes, finding new outlets for advertising, increasing enrollment, creating revenue, analyzing each program, being good stewards of God's finances and moving ACA forward.

We began the 2022-23 school year with excitement as we launched our very own ACA@Home Program. Our in-person enrollment increased to 292 from 265, with an additional 20 brand new students in our Preschool and Junior Kindergarten Programs, 191 Home

Education Students and welcomed several new International students. Which brought our enrollment to over 500 students!

We continue to offer additional programs that generate revenue and increase enrollment.

Additional Programs:

- Calgary Busing Program continues to be a success, with one bus coming from two stops in North Calgary daily
- Relaunched Solid Grounds Café, under the leadership of some of our Secondary students
- Preschool, Junior Kindergarten and Out of School Care Programs continue to grow



- Alternative Programs (International Students, ACA@Home, Airdrie Camps)
- Rentals

We continue to run a pretty tight reign on expenses. We took an in-depth look at our expenditures in the fall and made several adjustments to staffing, budgets and spending to help address the rising inflation costs, interest rate increases and debt repayment.

The challenges we face are building up our monthly donor base and debt repayment.

Our budget is tight, and as projected, we should end the fiscal year with a small surplus. Our gifts and donations have fallen short in the first part of the year. We rely on donations to make up a part of our Operating Budget, so please consider how you, your friends and your family can support us in this way.

Our rental income has restarted this year after the decrease we experienced as a result of Covid-19 restrictions. This additional revenue is quite beneficial to our bottom line.

Fundraising is another portion that makes up our Operating Budget. Fundraisers like the Davison Orchard Apple Sale, Growing Smiles Plant Sale and ACA Shopping Card Program help our bottom line and assist with keeping tuition costs down.

Philippians 4:19 says, "And my God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus."

We must remain conservative with our spending while providing the best educational environment possible for our students. We are very thankful for each family that calls ACA "home" and look forward to continuing this growth trend. Our facility is well suited as a positive learning environment and our staff is made up of incredible, godly people who truly

care about children. The family atmosphere that exists within our parent body is truly amazing.

We are looking ahead to the 2023-24 school year, with the hope that we will be entering the school year with growth, enthusiasm, joy and thankfulness.

We are called by Jesus Christ to advance God's Kingdom by educating and training His children to personally know, love and serve Him. ACA is equipping and discipling generations for Christ. Great things are happening at ACA, and we are seeing the fruits in every student who graduates and goes out into the world as a disciple of Christ.

It's been a busy year in the world of Alternative Programs at ACA. Through it all, God is good!

International Student Program:

We were/are blessed to have 10 international students from countries like Chile, Spain, Nigeria, South Africa and Hong Kong this year. Each child is a gift from God to our school and it's been a pleasure to have them continue their discipleship journeys here. Our students, teachers and homestay families have done a wonderful job welcoming these students and making their transition to ACA and Canadian culture as smooth as possible. We are looking to expand our International student pool beyond 10 students for next year.

Airdrie Camps:

Through our camp programs, we have been able to reach hundreds of children from our community who come through our doors and enjoy great programming in basketball, badminton, day camps, sewing and more. Our camp program is continuing to grow with new initiatives and partnerships in 2023.

ACA@Home:

Our Home Education branch officially launched in September 2022 with just under 200 students registered in our programs and 12 teachers operating as facilitators and shared responsibility, teachers. Additionally, 95 of these students also join our Shared Responsibility classes here at ACA each Thursday, and it's wonderful to see the blending of our school communities on this busy day!
